91st LINZ AWARD RECIPIENT - MARGOT PEROT

Margot Perot embodies the spirit of civic servanthood and generosity. Over her lifetime, Perot has provided extensive leadership, time, and funding to countless local nonprofits. She served on boards such as the Salvation Army, Dallas Symphony Orchestra, Highland Park Presbyterian Church, Junior League of Dallas, Maureen Connolly Brinker Tennis Foundation. Texas Commission of the Arts, The Hockaday School, The Perot Museum of Nature and Science, and United Way of Metropolitan Dallas. In her various leadership roles, she's helped guide nonprofit executives to secure sustainable futures.

Perot has said that some of her most inspiring philanthropic efforts were with The Salvation Army, which she began working with in the early 1980s. Because of her work, she received the William Booth Award in 1997, the Evangeline Booth Award in 2002 and the Distinguish Auxiliary Service Award in 2013.


Perot has also supported the Dallas Opera, the North Texas Food Bank, the Dallas Museum of Art, UT Southwestern, and Children's Medical Center, just to name a few. She is also a founding member of the Ruth Sharp Altshuler Tocqueville Society and was awarded with the Decades of Distinction Award in 2017 by United Way.

REQUIREMENTS OF Nominees

For over 90 years, the Linz Award has symbolized the highest form of recognition for civic service and humanitarian accomplishments in the City of Dallas. Information provided on the nomination form will help determine the recipient of the annual Linz Award.

To be eligible for the award, the nominee(s) must:

- Be currently involved in community activities that have achieved extraordinary impact in civic or humanitarian service for at least 10 years in the City of Dallas
- Have received no monetary compensation for his/her/their efforts.
- Be available for the Linz Award luncheon in the Spring of 2021.
- Not be an elected official.
- Not be a previous Linz Award winner.
- Be an individual or married couple. Group nominations are not eligible.

All nominations must be fully and accurately completed, with three letters of recommendation and any supplemental information. From the eligible nominations, a panel of civic and business leaders will select the recipient of the 92nd Annual Linz Award. The presentation of the award will be made at the 2021 luncheon. The 92nd Annual Linz Award honoree will join this prestigious list of winners:
